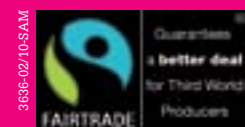

Whether you are a singer or instrumentalist; whether you prefer classical or popular styles; whether you like to listen or participate, we have outstanding musical opportunities to offer you throughout your time at BU.

The Music Centre & Kimmeridge House

Our facilities include a suite of rehearsal/lesson rooms equipped with drum kits, pianos and amplifiers. Opened in 2011, BU's Kimmeridge Hall is one of the most prestigious, state-of-the-art, medium- sized halls in the area. With over 300 seats and a Brodmann concert grand piano, the complex offers a flexible performance space for lectures, concerts, recitals, gigs and rehearsals. The auditorium has established Bournemouth University as one of the first UK institutions to allow live acoustics to be varied in 'real time'.

Performances

We are fortunate to have a close association with the internationally renowned Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra and the BSO Vibes project offers students the chance to attend Wednesday evening concerts at a discounted ticket price. On Campus there are regular concerts, recitals and gigs by internationally renowned artists as well as a lively programme of student performances.

Ensembles

BU Music offers a range of ensembles to suit instrumentalists and singers of all abilities.

We encourage students to start their own bands and ensembles and will always help with advice, equipment and performance opportunities wherever possible.

- **Choral Society** – performing major works from the classical repertoire
- **Contemporary Choir** – new for 2011/12, this is a modern vocal group for which there is no requirement to read music.
- **Chamber Choir** – an auditioned choir offering challenging repertoire for more experienced singers.

- **Samba Band** – new for 2011/12 – no previous experience necessary.
- **Orchestra** – working alongside the Bournemouth Youth Orchestra, BU Orchestra works on a wide repertoire and presents several concerts each year.
- **Big Band** – the University's jazz band welcomes instrumentalists and singers and gives regular performances, both on the campus and in the local area.

Art at BU

BU is proud of its continuing commitment to providing high quality art for the benefit of students, staff and the community. We have a dedicated art gallery, a yearly art exhibition programme, specially commissioned sculptures and works of art situated through the campuses along with our workshop programme, providing a creative and thoughtful studying environment.

Exhibition Programme 2011-12:

Art Loan

Each year the BU Art Loan strives to bring new and exciting feature exhibitions to the University, which can be seen throughout Talbot Campus. This year we are proud to present Phase II of our collaboration with the Elisabeth Frink Estate.

Evolution: Frink and the Next Generation

From October 2011 to July 2012, the public areas of Poole House, Thomas Hardy Suite, Kimmeridge House and the Atrium Art Gallery will showcase work by the late Dame Elisabeth Frink. Featuring selected work from her own collections and works from nationally and regionally recognised artists which demonstrate a range of creative processes and techniques.

The exhibition focuses on:

- Movement: ecology, change
- Surface: texture, text
- Colour & Pattern: sequencing, decoration.

The Atrium Art Gallery

The Gallery delivers a diverse programme of quality exhibitions, promoting work of national reputation and also recognises emerging local talent. In addition, Julie Herring, BU Curator and Annette Ratuszniak, Curator of the Frink Estate, will be presenting a number of exhibitions and

The gallery is open to the public from 9.00am - 6.00pm, Monday - Saturday.

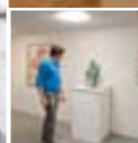
Art work in the public areas of both campuses can be seen at:
